Care for Kindies in 2022

With 2022 just around the corner, we are looking forward to meeting and getting to know all our new kindergarten children and families. In our understanding that new kindergarten children need extra care and support, we have developed a transition program to cater to their unique needs, allowing them to transition smoothly into our care.

During kindergarten we ensure that children are safe on their way from before school care to school by walking them to their class lines just before bell time and waiting with them until their teachers arrive. We also meet kindergarten children with a smile at their classrooms at the end of the school day and walk them to the after school care space. During their first session, we introduce them to our friendly staff and provide them with special time to explore the indoor space without the other children in the room so they can begin to feel safe and secure in the environment. We also regularly check in with each child throughout the sessions to ensure they are comfortable, and most importantly, enjoying themselves!

We are fortunate to have responsible and caring children attending our care that volunteer to be a buddies for new children. They help their younger buddies with activities like finding particular items, introducing them to other children, playing games and having fun, and assisting them with the routine.
