Introduction to Hair & Beauty for Formals and Special Events	St Leonard's	Friday	This practical based course focuses on hair and makeup essentials for Formals and Special Events. Over the seven weeks students will learn skills in foundation application, eye design and application, manicures and facials, along with an overview of the Beauty Industry. Note: This is a practical course where students work in pairs. TAFE NSW follows strict COVID guidelines. All students are required to wear Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) supplied by TAFE to keep all participants safe. Students will need to wear a face mask and shield when working closely with each other. Students will be required to wear a protective gown.
Introduction to Gaming and Animation	St Leonard's	Friday	This course teaches critical thinking, basic game design concepts and working in teams. Using Unity game engine, Visual Studio and Blender or Mayer you will learn how to create art assets, build levels within games, write C# code, implement game mechanics, add sounds to games and more. Dress: Neat casual
Introduction to Health Services (Nursing)	St Leonard's	Monday	Infection control, hand hygiene, First Aid including basic life support, emergency anaphylaxis and asthma management, manual handling, mobility aid, bed making, acute care skills including temperature, pulse, blood pressure, blood glucose and urine testing. Introduction to healthy body systems. Note: Students must wear leather, closed in footwear, white shirt (polo shirt also suitable), long pants, no jeans.
Introduction to Information Technology	St Leonard's	Friday	This course will provide an overview of key aspects of the industry. This includes: Computer hardware, Operating Systems, Introduction to Python Programming, Cybersecurity, and Web Design.
Photography	Ultimo	Friday	Master the use of a digital camera, compose better photos, and use industry standard software applications such as Adobe Light room to further enhance your images. All equipment is provided including digital SLR cameras for use each week during class. How to turn your hobby into a profession. Introduction to Automotive (Mechanics and Body Repair)	Ultimo	Friday	You will fabricate and repair body panels, learn basic spray painting and custom painting, dismantle a car and mechanical components including an engine. Practical skills towards what could be an excellent apprenticeship/career. Note: Students are to provide and wear steel capped boots, full length overalls or long cotton drill pants and shirt. Due to COVID restrictions and PPE requirements: Students are required to supply their own leather riggers gloves (available from Bunnings or Total Tools \$5 approx.), clear safety glasses (available same suppliers \$3-\$5). TAFE will supply – disposable ear plugs, P2 dust masks and latex disposable.
Electrical Trades	Ultimo	Thursday	Working with different wiring; Using hand tools; Wiring from electrical drawings; WHS for this industry, use testing meters. Note: Mandatory clothing : Students are to provide and wear steel capped boots, long cotton drill pants and long sleeve cotton shirt and clear safety glasses.
Music	Ultimo	Friday	Get hands on making music using instruments, electronics and computers. Write songs, perform with others, music industry business, do some simple recording project collaborations.
