- If your child is in Kindergarten in 2021 your child will begin school in Week 2 on Wednesday 3rd
 February at 9.30am. From Thursday 4th February Kindergarten students will start school each
 day at 9am
- If your child is in Year 1 to 6 in 2021, your child will begin school on Friday, 29th January at 9am.

Before school procedures on your child's first day in 2021

- When students in Years 1-6 arrive to school on their first day back for 2021, they should come
 to the Burra gorang. Students will line up in their 2020 classes, and will be met by their 2020
 teacher.
- In 2021, the K-6 school day commences at 9am and finishes at 2.45pm for years K-2 and 3pm for years 3-6. Primary school students should arrive to school between 8:40am and 9:00am. No primary students should be on the school site and unsupervised before 8:40am. A teacher will be on duty from 8:40am. Any students arriving to school prior to 8:40am must attend Camp Australia.
- Students attending before school care should arrive with a parent/carer after 7am and proceed directly to Camp Australia.
- On arrival to school, students are reminded that prior to 9am is a time for passive play on the Burra gorang only. This includes sitting and talking to friends and passive, quiet games. No balls should be kicked, passed or thrown and no running games are to be played. This ensures the safety of all community members in our playground before school. High school students have different break times to primary school students.
- As we begin the 2021 school year, we will be finalising new enrolments. Once we have an
 accurate understanding of student numbers, we will be able to begin the process of forming
 classes. When forming classes, we take into consideration the social and academic needs of each
 individual student, and how students may work together with others. This is an important
 process that we spend some time completing, to ensure that full consideration is given to how
 the classes are formed.

After school procedures

- Kindergarten students being collected by parents on foot will be collected from the Bunin Gate at 2.45pm
- Stage One (Years 1 & 2) students being collected by parents will be collected from the Belmont St Gate at 2.45pm
- Stage Two (Years 3 & 4) students being collected by parents will be collected from the Bunin Gate at 3.00pm
- Stage Three (Years 5 & 6) students being collected by parents will be collected from the Belmont St Gate at 3.00pm
- If you are collecting siblings, the procedure is to collect them from the gate designated to the eldest sibling. Eg. A boy in Kindergarten with an older sibling in Year Three would be collected from the Bunin Gate at 3pm. A girl in year one with an older sibling in Year Five would be collected from the Belmont St Gate at 3pm
- Camp Australia will meet their students at the Camp Australia door at the back of the Burra gorang
- Chess and Yoga teachers will meet their students on the Burra gorang
- Kiss and Go students and students catching the school buses will use the bus bay gate at 3pm with a teacher supervising at the gate. Parents must notify teachers if their child is being picked up by car or travelling by bus
- Students who are walking home independently should leave straight after school from their designated gate.

School administration office - holiday opening hours

The Bunin (school administration office), will be open from 9.30am – 2pm on *Thursday 21st and Friday 22nd* January 2021. Office staff will be able to answer any administrative questions you have during this time. Our office staff will also be able to assist you with the purchase of uniforms and the payment of contributions and fees for Kindergarten to Year 12.



Bicycles and Scooters at school

It is great to see many students (and parents) who walk or ride their bikes or scooters to and from school. In this way physical activity is seamlessly integrated into the school day. Riders who bring their bicycles and scooters and skateboards onto school grounds, are responsible for safe riding behaviours

- Students are to always correctly wear an Australian Standards approved helmet when riding.
- Students must always ride in a safe manner following these guidelines and the NSW road rules relating to bicycles.
- Bicycles and scooters are not to be ridden in school grounds during or after school hours. All
 riders, students and adults are to dismount before entering the school grounds and walk their
 bikes or scooters with them whilst on the school grounds.
- Storing their bike or scooter in the correct manner in the appropriate storage area.

Parents and carers are responsible for:

- ensuring their child is wearing adequate protective gear, including a helmet, knee pads, wrist guards, elbow guards as required and that the bike or scooter is in good working order
- reinforcing the rules and safety advice for riding scooters and bikes to and from school

BIKES AND SCOOTERS ARE NOT TO BE RIDDEN INSIDE THE SCHOOL BY TEACHERS, PARENTS, STUDENTS OR VISITORS.

Primary school uniform for Kindergarten to Year 6 students

School uniform description

- APCS Red with blue sleeve polo shirt
- Navy shorts or navy pants or navy skirt or navy skort shorts and skirts are to be worn to a modest and reasonable length for school attire.

These items are NOT school uniform

- Hoodies
- Non APCS Jumpers, cardigans and pullovers

Sun Safety

All students should wear an Alexandria Park Community School hat at all times when in the school playground or on excursions. Hats can be purchased from the school uniform shop. K-6 students are required to follow the rule of 'No Hat, No Play'. All students should apply sunscreen each morning before school.

Food breaks & healthy eating

1:50pm - 1:55pm)

All students are encouraged to eat a healthy and nutritious lunch and afternoon tea snack. This includes plenty of fruit and vegetables. Students should bring a refillable drink bottle with them to school every day, which can be refilled at one of the many bubblers or drinking fountains in the playground. Please minimise packaged food, which contributes to waste problems and can be difficult for younger students to open.

School canteen



PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) at Alexandria Park Community School

Positive Behaviour for Learning, known as PBL is an evidence-based whole school systems approach that:

- Addresses the diverse academic and social needs of every student to support them to be successful
- Supports students in early childhood settings through to senior years of schooling
- Enables schools to establish a continuum of supports that are intensified to meet the needs of every student
- Is team driven, using a problem solving approach (data, systems and practices) that engages students, parents and all school staff
- Establishes positive social expectations for all in the school community
- Provides a framework for the school and its community to collectively support the wellbeing of every student.



At Alex Park:

- Students respond positively as they have been taught what is expected of them
- Staff deliver consistent responses to student learning and behaviour
- Students feel safe and cared for at school. Their parents, family and community are more involved in their school
- Unproductive and challenging behaviour can be significantly reduced for most students.

Reward Systems:

- At Alex Park, we use a reward system where students are given 'Deadlies' for showing the PBL values of 'be a learner, be respectful and be safe'
- Deadlies are accumulated by individual students and students are able to participate in the annual PBL carnival
- Students may be given verbal praise, positive acknowledgement, merit awards or a PBL sticker to reinforce the PBL values



BEHAVIOUR CODE FOR STUDENTS

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
