Fittingly the teacher won the maths challenge. Well done Mr Medway on winning the maths challenge and on your outstanding career.

Preparing for the implementation of new curriculum incorporating the Australian curriculum

Our teachers have been focussing their professional learning on collaborating in cluster and faculty teams to review current curriculum programs and plan for the implementation of the new Australian curriculum for 2014. The new curriculum to be introduced in K - 6 is English. In years 7 & 9 it is English, Mathematics, Science and History. Teachers have been working with the support materials provided by the NSW Board of Studies and also the NSW DEC on line professional learning courses. Student details and medical forms

During Terms 3 and 4 we will be updating our student details and medical records to ensure we have the most up-to-date information on your child's contact information and health. If you have a child with a medical condition you will receive a copy of the new forms and you will need to fill them out and return them to us as soon as you can.

The good news is we have already started collecting some of this information, which means less for you to do. The new forms will help us collect your child's important medical information and the introduction of new systems will mean we'll be able to better manage the daily and emergency health needs of your child. We appreciate your support as we start collecting the information, and if you have any questions please call the school to speak with your child's teacher or year advisor.

Attendance & Punctuality to School

All children between the ages of six and seventeen years are required to attend school regularly. Positive student learning outcomes occur within a stable learning environment.

At Alexandria Park Community School, we aim to improve student attendance, minimise lateness and truancy in order to improve student achievements and outcomes, thus ensuring success in post scholastic life.

Starting in Term 3, roll marking will take place for Years K-4 at 9am and Years 5-12 at 8.50am. If a student is not present at school, an SMS will be sent to parents/caregivers by 9.45am. This new procedure will allow parents/caregivers to be notified as early as possible that their child is not present at school. If a student arrives late to school they are to sign in at the front office and will receive a Late Slip and marked as present at school. The Late Slip is handed to the class teacher.

NAIDOC Celebration

Thank you to all families and community members who attended our NAIDOC celebration last term, we were honoured to have you! It was such a huge success and we were so proud to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Yirrkala Bark Petitions to the Federal Parliament.
