PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

In Kindergarten, we have been learning about how plants grow and what they need to survive. The children predicted what would happen and took regular notes and drew pictures to record their seed's growth and progress. Mad Science Day



National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of Science and Technology. On Thursday the 17th August, Alexandria Park Community School celebrated National Science Week by hosting a 'Mad Science Day' for Year 5 to Year 7 students.

The theme for this year was Drones, Droids and Robots. Students were given the opportunity to dress up as their favorite Scientist. Students spent the day rotating through a variety of workshops run by their school teachers. These workshops included; Drone technology, using lenses to make an I-phone projector, creating rainbows with light, lava lamps, balloon rockets and cubed bubble in a bubble. We also had an inflatable Planetarium, where students were shown the night sky and star constellations. They were also able to watch a 3D movie on space.

Students were given a great opportunity to immerse themselves into the world of Science (and Technology) through hands on learning.



<mark>Year 7 Science</mark>

We have had a busy term in Science. Students learned about the importance of classification as well as the different types of forces and how they can help us in the 'real world'. Students were able to draw and map the magnetic field lines of a bar magnet as well as use electrostatic force to bend water with a balloon. We tested the aerodynamics of paper planes and how air resistance can impact the plane's flight. Students should start revising the work they have done this year in Science in preparation for Yearly exams in term 4.



MATHS MATTERS

Students in year 8 have been involved in an assessment task called 'The Block'. The task involved students working in groups to create a floor plan & 3D model for a studio apartment or house for a selected suburb. To create the floor plan and 3D model, students used Google Sketch. At the end of the project, students attended a mock auction where they presented the properties using Power point presentations and persuasive language to convince the potential buyers of their property's value. The students were very engaged in the task with many groups producing brochures for their properties. A great atmosphere was created at the auction for both students and buyers.



The Australian Mathematics Competition results were particularly impressive this year with 5 high distinct and 14 distinctions achieved across the school from years 3 to 10. Congratulations to all students who participated.

Year 12 students have been working hard in preparation for their HSC exams and we wish them well.

SYDNEY STUDENTS GET CHEESY





Over 74 excited students were recognised at a 'Cows Create Careers – Camembert in the Classroom 'presentation day, held on Friday 2nd September 2016 at the Blacktown RSL.

Camembert in the Classroom is an innovative Dairy Australia program designed to encourage secondary school teachers and students to learn about the Australian dairy industry, while introducing students to dairy manufacturing careers and pathways.

Teachers from six schools across the Sydney region will participate in the program including Shoalhaven High School, Albion Park High School, **Alexandria Park Community School**, Vincentia High School, Pittwater High School and Greenpoint Christian College.

Teachers were trained to make camembert cheese by program presenter and Deputy Chief Judge of the Australian Grand Dairy Awards, Russell Smith. They then transferred this knowledge to their students.

Over a term, students made their own camembert cheese in the classroom and completed assessment tasks, including a multimedia advertisement. Upon completion of the program, Russell Smith, along with accredited judges, awarded the region's winning and runner up cheeses.

Camembert in the Classroom program manager, Dr Mani Iyer, believes that the Dairy Australia program is a great hands-on platform to introduce both teachers and secondary students to the Australian dairy industry, dairy processes and dairy products.

"Since its launch in 2011, the Camembert in the Classroom program has grown significantly in its popularity" Dr Iyer said.

"In 2015, over 101 schools from Victoria, South Australia, NSW, Tasmania, Queensland and Western Australia participated in the program, with all of the schools incorporating the program into their school curriculum."

The Cows Create Careers program is funded and managed by Dairy Australia and conducted by Jaydee Events Pty Ltd.

UNSW Sun Sprint Solar Car Challenge - Saturday 3rd September 2016

APCS entered the sun sprint solar car challenge this year for the first time. This event has been run for 15 years and we were up against some experienced racers. Jerry Sun and Johan Huq from Yr7 represented our school with solar cars they built during Enrichment Programs with Mr Alexopoulos. The boys did really well on the day their cars were very competitive but most importantly they had lots of fun racing against all the other schools. Overall the boys finished 7th out of almost 70 entries. We can walk away proud because the car that went on to win the event was the car that knocked us out of the competition by only a fraction of a second. The Tell Them From Me parent feedback survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. This term parents and carers are given the opportunity to participate.

The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online at home or on public computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 13th August and 21 October. Computer facilities are available on both the Junior and Senior campus offices.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. However, your responses are very much appreciated.
