## Curriculum

This table provides an overview of key topic areas for the term.

Key Learning Area	Topics/ Strands	Content Covered
English	Writing  Reading Comprehension	Students will develop their understanding of how stories can be communicated using images. Through an in-depth study of a wordless picture book and animated short films, they will explore how visual narratives are constructed.  Students will explore a range of strategies for reading comprehension, and collaborate in groups to discuss and analyse a range of texts.

Maths	Working mathematically	Students will learn how to describe and represent mathematical situations in a variety of ways using mathematical terminology and some conventions.
	Whole number	Students apply place value to order, read and represent numbers of up to and beyond five digits
	Addition and Subtraction	Students develop efficient strategies for addition and subtraction and recognise patterns.
	Time	Students read and record time in one-minute intervals and convert between hours, minutes and seconds.
	Length	Students will estimate, measure and record lengths and distances using millimetres, centimetres, metres and kilometres.
	Area	Students will measure, record, compare and estimate areas using square centimetres and square metres.
History	Community and Remembrance	This topic provides a study of identity and diversity in both a local and a broader context. Moving from the heritage of their local area, students explore the historical features and diversity of their community.
Science and Technology	Material World	Students will participate in a range of STEAM activities to develop an understanding of the relationship between solids and liquids through a real world learning context.
Arts	Visual Arts	Students explore visual literacy and will use a variety of media to create artworks.
	Music	Students will study the guitar and participate in a range of singing, performing, listening and movement tasks. Students are introduced to common chords and riffs from famous music of the last 50 years, gaining the ability to perform a selection of popular music.
PDHPE	Safety and Well being	Students investigate safe and unsafe features of specific environments and explore actions to enhance their own and others' safety and well being.

	Games and sports	Students will participate in a range of activities to improve physical fitness. They will learn how to run a fitness lesson

There will be many exciting events throughout the year, including the Premier's Reading Challenge, Book Week, book fairs and more. Students are highly encouraged to borrow from the library, but are required to have a library bag to do so.
