

K-12 Learning From Home Parent 'Check in' Feedback Survey Summary

Thank you to all our parents and carers that completed the K-12 Parent Check In Survey regarding Week 1 Term Three Learning from Home 13th-16th July 2021. We received 209 parent responses to the survey. This information provided a valuable snapshot from your perspective regarding our first week of learning from home. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, and we thank you for working with us.

1) 98% reported that your child has been able to access their at home learning (either online or paper package)

2) 8% reported you need further help to support your child to access online learning

3) 98.5% reported that communication from the school has been excellent, good or satisfactory

4) 38% reported teachers have been able to provide teaching and learning activities to engage your child in the online environment to a great extent. With 47% reporting teachers have been able to provide teaching and learning activities to engage your child in the online environment adequately.

5) 95% reported that your child has participated in online lessons or meetings with their teacher and other classmates with 98% reported finding the online lessons or meetings beneficial

Some comments

I like how the work load for the kids is not too much but enough to keep them going with very clear instructions and directions. Some teachers have even done a video clearly outlining the lesson which is fantastic.

Social interaction is really important for my daughter. Online lunchtime meetings with friends on Skype and zoom is helping her stay connected with her friends and is helpful for mental health

The face to face classes are very helpful for parents!

Far more simplified than 2020 which has been enormously helpful in making it doable. What is especially helpful is where teachers post at the start of the week everything for that week.

Very organised. And the wellness check phone call was really appreciated. Thanks! Keep up the good work.

The home learning activities are so good compared to last year - well done everyone !!

The Principal and School Executive are currently investigating workable solutions to any issues raised. Including but not limited to, providing explicit daily timetables across K-12, ensuring break times and physical activity are included in each daily timetable, the inclusion of vocal instructions in google classroom and the possibility of running zoom parent information sessions addressing; how to navigate Google classroom, how to help students unsure of how to do the set tasks and how to best structure a day of Learning from Home.
